**Session 3: Top Ten Senior Care Risks – Strategies for Defensibility (Walker Bay Ballroom)**

**Content:** Senior care leaders are facing unprecedented challenges including recruitment and retention of staff, reimbursement, consumer expectations, increasing regulatory requirements, higher acuity resident care needs, mental and behavioral health care needs, emergency preparedness, and requirements for comprehensive programs addressing infection prevention and control, quality, compliance, and risk management. Today's challenges are straining the senior care industry fueling regulatory fines, sanctions, cited deficiencies, professional liability claims and, in some cases, closing facilities. Maintaining practices that support defensibility for recurring risks (e.g., falls, pressure injuries, elopement, improper care, delay in seeking medical treatment) as well as emerging risks (e.g., cyber security, workplace violence, competency-based education and training for higher-acuity resident care needs) is an important risk management focus. This interactive presentation will address the current state of professional liability risk exposure, claim trends, high-level deficiency trends, and the top senior care risk management issues from a legal, practice and administrative perspective. Case examples will address identified risk issues related to clinical care and operations and the impact on defensibility.
