"For our federal POC we have added annual testing within our building to our water management plan as that was what the surveyor was really hung up on. I am using a lab out of MN, (Jon 612.804.2411). The cost is roughly \$150 per sample (we did 6 per this contacts recommendation) so roughly \$900 annual expense. The other thing that was imperative was to creating documentation for running faucets flushing toilets and running shower heads in vacant rooms, along with documentation of running eye wash stations." Human Services Committee Discusses Geriatric Psychiatric Services

On December 18, 2023 the Interim Human Services Committee met and discussed the current state of geriatric psychiatric care services. Dr. Yabut, Medical Director at the ND State Hospital discussed the current availability across the state. He said they have a 24 bed unit that provides geriatric psychiatric services and they continually operate at near or over-capacity every day. The median age of the current patients in this unit is 65. The average daily rate is \$968. Dr. Yabut's testimony can be viewed here: <u>Dr. Yabut @1:39:27pm</u>

Pam Sagness, Executive Director of Behavioral Health with DHHS provided testimony regarding

Shelly Peterson of the Association, provided comments regarding services available through the three geropsychiatric nursing facilities and the need for greater access to psychiatric inpatient care for residents residing in basic care, assisted living, and nursing facilities. Travis Booke, a physician assistant with CHI Health Dickinson, provided testimony regarding the lack of services for this population and the struggles a critical access hospital goes through to try and find services for older adults with behavioral health issues. The legislative interim committee is studying this issue and at this point is still gathering information. The North Dakota Long Term Care Association has reached out to the North Dakota Hospital Association regarding a meeting with them, including hospitals and long term care providers, to examine this issue and suggest solutions for better addressing the behavioral health needs of our older population.

F680 please refer to and review the regulation

F680 is an absolute tag, meaning a facility must have a qualified activities professional or F680 will be cited, whether or not there have been negative outcomes to residents. When asked how a facility could correct the non-compliance when it is difficult for rural areas to hire qualified activities professionals, especially when a state training course takes six to 12 months to complete.

The SA asked the CMS Regional location about this and a SNF could use a consultant. The guidance we received was facilities could utilize a qualified professional (i.e., consultant, OT, or OTA) to **direct** the "development, implementation, supervision and ongoing evaluation of the activities program" until their employee completes the state training course.

The qualified professional meet the regulation by:

- "... the completion and/or directing/delegating the completion of the activities component of the comprehensive assessment; and contributing to and/or directing/delegating the contribution to the comprehensive care plan goals and approaches that are individualized to match the skills, abilities, and interests/preferences of each resident."

- "... scheduling of activities, both individual and groups, implementing and/or delegating the implementation of the programs, monitoring the response and/or reviewing/evaluating the response to the programs to determine if the activities meet the assessed needs of the resident, and making revisions as necessary."

As you can see, the language in the guidance allows for delegation. The facility should provide surveyors with the evidence of how the qualified "consultant" will be directing the program, what they will be delegating and how they will be monitoring/reviewing/evaluating the program to ensure resident's needs are met.
