



HUD's 232 Program-Updates in Production and Asset Management

• Webinar: HUD's 232 Program-Updates in Production and Asset

Management - Sept 17th at 2pm ET

AHCA/NCAL, along with the Healthcare Mortgagee Advisory Council (HMAC) and the Mortgage Bankers Association (MAB), has been actively addressing concerns with HUD regarding a legal opinion from the Office of General Counsel (OGC). This opinion challenges the current guidelines allowing non-critical repairs to be covered by Section 232 loan proceeds, which could severely impact long-term care (LTC) operators' ability to finance necessary facility upgrades.

The legal interpretation, if upheld, would limit LTC facilities' ability to fund certain repairs, making HUD a less viable financing option. However, following a recent meeting with HUD officials, it was clarified that "business as usual" will continue for now, allowing non-critical repairs to be included in all transactions. While this is a temporary win, AHCA/NCAL and partners are pushing for a permanent

resolution to maintain the current financing practices. A coalition letter to HUD leadership is part of these ongoing efforts.

Observation Stays Appeal Update

On July 25th, the Center for Medicare Advocacy (CMA) released an <u>article</u> noting that "the federal judge who found that Medicare is violating beneficiaries' constitutional rights by disallowing appeals of their placement on 'observation status' in hospitals has imposed deadlines and urged Medicare to 'take all possible steps, as a matter of urgent agency policy' to expedite implementation of the court-ordered appeals."

More specifically, the judge ordered the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to publish the final rule implementing the appeals by October 15, 2024; to finalize educational and other instructional materials by November 8, 2024; and to address in its next status report to the court whether outside contractors can be given tight timeframes so that appeals can be made operational by the end of 2024. FTC Non-Competes Ban Update – No Longer Effective Sept. 4th

As noted previously by AHCA/NCAL, on April 23, 2024, the <u>Federal Trade</u> <u>Commission's (FTC's) Final Non-Compete Rule</u> was released and was scheduled to go into effect 120 days after publication in the Federal Register (effective September 4, 2024). The rule would make nearly all preexisting and future U.S. non-compete agreements with workers unenforceable, except for preexisting non-compete agreements with "senior executives." The AHCA/NCAL summary released earlier this year on the rule can be found <u>here</u>.

Recently, a federal judge in Texas barred the FTC rule from taking effect. The U.S. District Judge said the FTC does not have the authority to ban practices it deems unfair methods of competition by adopting broad rules.

Migration and the future of care: Supporting older people and care workers

High-income countries are facing a growing demand for elder care amid significant workforce shortages. These shortages are due to low pay, poor

working conditions, and the undervalued nature of care work, which is heavily influenced by its feminization and recent trends in austerity, privatization, and marketization. Migrant workers play a crucial role in filling gaps left by insufficient formal care systems and making care affordable, but they often face lower wages and worse conditions, especially in home care and when undocumented. There are few labor migration pathways that ensure fair employment conditions for care workers. To meet the rising demand for elder care, countries must make the sector more attractive to local workers and prioritize ethical, sustainable international recruitment as a policy focus.
