
AHCA/NCAL Cancels Delivering Solutions 24 Due to Tropical Storm Milton

CMS Reminds Providers of Residents' Rights Related to Voting

On September 26, 2024, the Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) released <u>QSO-</u> <u>24-21-NH</u>, Compliance with Residents' Rights Requirement related to Nursing Home Residents' Right to Vote. The purpose of the memo is to affirm the regulatory expectation that nursing home residents can exercise their right to vote without interference, coercion, discrimination, or reprisal from the facility.

CMS emphasized current regulations under Residents' Rights related to exercising the right to vote as a citizen of the United States, including the use of mail for mail-in or absentee ballots, as outlined below:

- §483.10(b) Exercise of Rights: The resident has the right to exercise his or her rights as a resident of the facility and **as a citizen or resident of the United States.**
- §483.10(b)(1): The facility must ensure that the resident **can exercise his or her rights** without interference, coercion, discrimination, or reprisal from the facility.
- §483.10(b)(2): The resident has the right to be **supported by the facility in the exercise** of his or her rights as required under this subpart.

In addition, CMS highlighted regulations regarding residents' inability to cast in-person ballots and the use of mail-in ballots. CMS regulations specific to the use of mail, which also apply to voting, include:

- §483.10(g)(7): The facility must protect and facilitate the resident's right to communicate with individuals and entities within and outside of the facility, including reasonable access to:
 - (i) A telephone, including TTY and TDD services;
 - (ii) The internet, to the extent available to the facility; and
 - (iii) Stationery, postage, writing implements, and the ability to send mail.
- §483.10(h)(2): The facility must respect the resident's right to personal privacy, including the right to privacy in his or her oral (i.e., spoken), written, and electronic communications, including the right to send and promptly receive unopened mail and other letters, packages, and materials delivered to the facility for the resident, including those delivered through means other than a postal service.
- "Promptly" means delivery of mail or other materials to the resident within 24 hours of delivery by the postal service (including a post office box) and delivery of outgoing mail to the postal service within 24 hours, except when there is no regularly scheduled postal delivery and pick-up service.

Mandatory Provider Enrollment Off-Cycle Revalidation for ALL SNFs

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services recently issued an announcement in the <u>MLN</u> <u>Connects newsletter</u> that all skilled nursing facility providers will receive off-cycle provider enrollment revalidation notices from their Medicare Administrative Contractor (MAC) to collect additional data on ownership, managerial, and related party information not previously required. This information is to be submitted in a new Appendix on the <u>Form CMS-</u> <u>855A</u> (09/24) version.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

- Be on the lookout for a letter from your MAC from October through December 2024 regarding a mandatory off-cycle revalidation. Approximately one-third of SNFs will receive these notices each month.
- Providers will have 90 days from the date of the letter to respond and submit the newly required information into the <u>Medicare Provider Enrollment, Chain, and Ownership</u> System (PECOS) system to keep their provider enrollment status active.
- The requested information is quite complex and affects every SNF, regardless of size or ownership characteristics.
- SNF providers no longer report in Sections 5 and 6 of the provider enrollment form, but in a new SNF-specific Appendix. Instructions for the new SNF Appendix are <u>here</u>.
- In addition to SNF revalidation timeline discussed above, the new <u>Form CMS-855A</u> must be used for all of the following provider enrollment transactions effective October 1, 2024:
- a. Initial Enrollment
- b. Revalidations
- c. Reactivations
- d. CHOW

Note: If the status of any SNF transaction for a-d above prior to October 1 is "pending" in PECOS as of October 1, the MAC will request the new Appendix be completed by the SNF provider.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO

- 1. Review the new Form CMS-855A and the new GUIDANCE FOR SNF ATTACHMENT ON FORM CMS-855A.
- 2. CMS and AHCA/NCAL suggest providers seek counsel from an attorney to help interpret the new SNF reporting requirements.
- 3. Begin compiling the new information that will be required to be reported ASAP.
