September Meetings and Fall Conference Update

At the recent board and membership meetings, the 2025 budget was approved, reflecting a negative bottom line due to legislative year expenses. However, the association is well-prepared with reserves in place and rising sponsorships have bolstered financial stability. The board approved a 4% increase in dues to help maintain momentum, and the addition of a new Vice President of Government Affairs promises stronger advocacy efforts moving forward.

Exciting changes to the by-laws were passed, including the formation of a new Workforce Committee, which will focus on addressing workforce challenges in long term care. Additionally, we proudly awarded four \$1,000 Allan B. Engen Nurse scholarships to deserving student nurses, reflecting our ongoing commitment to building the future workforce.

On the legislative front, the members provided support for Senator Davison's bill to establish minimum standards for contract nursing agencies. There was also a successful push to adjust administrative code requirements for activities professionals, reducing mandatory training hours from 180 to 90, making it more feasible for professionals to efficiently meet state requirements.

The Fall Conference was a tremendous success with 367 attendees engaging in a wide range of educational sessions, and NDLTCA-PAC members showed their dedication with enthusiastic participation throughout the One Piano, Too Much Fun event.

IMPORTANT - New Resources and Relief on Provider Enrollment Off-Cycle Revalidation

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Reminder from last newsletter- CMS recently issued an announcement in the <u>MLN Connects</u> <u>newsletter</u> that all skilled nursing facility providers will receive off-cycle provider enrollment revalidation notices from their Medicare Administrative Contractor (MAC) to collect additional data on ownership, managerial, and related party information not **previously required**. This information is to be submitted in a new Appendix on the Form CMS-<u>855A</u> (09/24) version.

Make sure to get your info in within the 90 days or show a good faith effort or your payments may be at risk. Consider participating in <u>What you need to know webinar</u> and utilize tools coming from AHCA. We also received additional information from the CMS regarding the mandatory off-cycle revalidation process for NFs that offer all providers some additional support and relief with the reporting requirements.

Here's a brief summary of the updates from CMS:

- 1. CMS has scheduled an <u>Open Door Forum for Thursday, October 17</u> where it will discuss expanded ownership disclosures.
- 2. The agency released updated guidance on Friday, October 11 with an email address so providers can ask questions directly (<u>SNFDisclosures@cms.hhs.gov</u>).
- 3. Earlier this week, CMS also updated sub-regulatory guidance so that fewer people have to report personal identifiable information, such as social security numbers and dates of birth.

Volume of ND bill draft requests up significantly ahead of 2025 session

INFORUM - North Dakota lawmakers have already requested 422 bills and resolutions to be drafted for the 2025 legislative session, double the number requested at this time two years ago, Legislative Council staff say. "We're double the pace, but we haven't even hit the heavy drafting periods," Bjornson told members of the Legislative Procedure and Arrangements Committee earlier this month. The average number of bill drafts requested per legislator has trended up in the last decade, with about 10 bill drafts per lawmaker in 2023 compared to seven in 2013, a Legislative Council analysis shows. Nine lawmakers requested 21 or more bill drafts in 2023.

Nursing Facility Guidance:

Requirements for Using Psychotropic Medications

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<u>F758 of the CMS State Operations Manual (SOM) Appendix PP</u> offers guidance to surveyors for long-term care (LTC) facilities on the use of psychotropic medications. It includes a broader definition of psychotropics and provides additional guidance on other medications used for psychotropic purposes.

The guidance specifying the requirements for psychotropic medication use applies to antipsychotics, antidepressants, antianxiety, and hypnotic medications, without exception. It further clarifies that any medication affecting brain activity is subject to these requirements if it appears to be given in place of another psychotropic medication (such as antihistamines, anticholinergic medications, and central nervous system agents). Surveyors are directed to screen for medications prescribed for an inadequate indication to determine if they were used to sedate or restrict movement or cognition.

According to the SOM, if antipsychotic medications are prescribed, documentation must clearly show the indication for the antipsychotic medication, the multiple attempts to implement care planned, non-pharmacological approaches, and ongoing evaluation of the effectiveness of these interventions. It is important to keep in mind that diagnoses alone do not necessarily warrant the use of an antipsychotic medication.

Antipsychotic medications may be indicated if:

- Behavioral symptoms present a danger to the resident or others.
- Expressions or indications of distress are of significant distress to the resident.
- Multiple non-pharmacological approaches have been attempted (if not clinically contraindicated) but did not relieve the symptoms that are presenting a danger or significant distress.
- Gradual dose reduction (GDR) was attempted, but clinical symptoms returned.

The requirements underlying this guidance emphasize the importance of seeking an appropriate dose and duration for each medication and minimizing the risk of adverse consequences. The purpose of GDR is to find an optimal dose or to determine whether continued use of the medication is benefiting the resident. Tapering may be indicated when the resident's clinical condition has improved or stabilized, the underlying causes of the original target symptoms have resolved, and/or non-pharmacological approaches have been effective in reducing the symptoms.

What you can do TODAY to help maintain compliance with antipsychotic medications:

• Establish a schedule to review all residents who are taking antipsychotic medication.

- Prioritize residents who show signs and symptoms of side effects or have PRN (as needed) orders for medication review, discontinuation, or schedule routinely.
- Share the review findings with the interdisciplinary team to prioritize medication reviews and determine the next steps for residents with negative responses.

Keep track of and report any trends, such as the number of PRN orders, to the facility's Quality Assurance and Performance Improvement (QAPI) committee.
