ReadyOp Trainings by ND HHS EPR have Begun!

ReadyOp the replacement software for HC Standard which will be going **live on March 14th**. ReadyOp is for Bed Availability Reporting, Resident Tracking and Mass Communication.

ReadyOp includes links to other important web pages such as HAN (Health Alert Network) Alerts, the state Medical Cache, etc.

All LTC facilities – **Skilled Nursing, Basic Care, Specialized Basic Care, and Assisted Living** must learn this software program to be prepared if an Emergency should arise. Usernames & Passwords have been sent to the contact on file for your facility.

Online live training sessions began on Tuesday, January 14th and will continue through March 13th, two times a week.

Thursday will be a review of the prior Tuesday session as well as Office Hours for any questions that may arise as you test the system for your facility.

Regulatory

Court Denies Preliminary Injunction in Kansas v. Becerra - Staffing Mandate

Quick update in the *State of Kansas v. Becerra*, the lawsuit filed by 20 state Attorneys General in Iowa. The plaintiffs’ motion for a preliminary injunction was denied. The Court determined that the plaintiffs did not sufficiently demonstrate that the injunction was necessary to prevent irreparable harm.

While this outcome is unfortunate, it was not unexpected. This is precisely why our case, *AHCA v. Becerra*, did not include a request for a preliminary injunction.

It’s important to note that this ruling does not impact the merits or strength of our case. The real issue before the courts remains: whether HHS and CMS have the authority to impose this

unrealistic and unfounded staffing mandate. We firmly believe they do not. Congress holds the authority to set specific staffing standards, not federal agencies acting beyond their scope.

We will continue to make this argument in the Northern District of Texas and remain confident in a favorable outcome. Stay tuned for updates as the case progresses.

New Resources Available Related to Revised LTC Survey Guidance

On November 18, 2024, the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) released [Revised Long-Term Care \(LTC\) Surveyor Guidance: Significant revisions to enhance quality and oversight of the LTC Survey Process](#).

The memo included significant changes to guidance in Appendix PP related to the updated regulatory areas. The changes will take effect, and surveyors will begin using the revised guidance, on February 24, 2025.

Over the next several weeks, AHCA will release Action Briefings related to the guidance updates. Two new action briefings have been posted to the [AHCA Survey Regulatory page](#) for review regarding [Professional Standards](#) and the [Medical Director](#). Each briefing includes an outline of significant changes made, along with action items facilities may take to achieve compliance in these areas.

The MDS 3.0 Manual Individual Correction/Deletion Request form is required under certain situations when a modification or inactivation is not appropriate. Previously, this was a manual process that required facilities to complete a paper form and send it via certified mail to the State Agency.

States Continue Adapting Assisted Living Regulations

Each year, NCAL publishes the "Assisted Living State Regulatory Review," to summarize key selected state requirements for assisted living licensure or certification. For every state and the District of Columbia, this report includes information on preselected topics such as which state agency licenses assisted living, recent legislative and regulatory updates affecting assisted living, scope of care, limitations of services, staffing, and training - to name a few.

States use several different terms to refer to assisted living, such as residential care and personal care homes. This report includes requirements for those types of communities that offer seniors housing, supportive services, personal-centered assistance with activities of daily living, and some level of health care.

Medicaid Expansion

BCBS Reminder for Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) Providers

BCBSND would like to remind providers of correct billing guidelines, relating to therapy services in a Skilled Nursing Facility (SNF) setting.

SNF claims have been identified where providers are billing therapy services on an outpatient claim(s) incorrectly. Please refer to our currently published [Inpatient Skilled Nursing Facility Billing Guidelines](#) for information on correct practices.

It is important to review and understand the guidelines to avoid billing errors. Per the above published guidance, Speech, Occupational and Physical therapy are included in the per-diem and should not be unbundled. However, if those services are being provided to a patient that isn't in an inpatient setting, the services should be billed on a CMS-1500.

CMS Releases Proposed 2026 Medicare Advantage Payment Policy Updates

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) recently released the proposed Calendar Year (CY) 2026 updates for Medicare Advantage (MA) and Part D payment policies.

Highlights include:

- A projected **4.33% average increase** in MA rates for 2026, amounting to over \$21 billion, though specific rates may vary due to risk adjustment and other factors.
- Completion of a three-year phase-in of CMS' revised payment formula, saving an estimated \$10.4 billion in 2026 while maintaining stable MA offerings.
- Updates to Part D payment methodology and implementation of drug price negotiation for high-cost drugs starting in 2026, expected to lower beneficiary costs.
- Progress toward using encounter-based data for risk adjustment, with a potential phase-in starting in 2027.

The final announcement is due by April 7, 2025. **AHCA/NCAL will submit comments by February 10, 2025.**
